Baby Island Heights Water Association Annual report for 2023

Annual meetings this year are scheduled for Saturday, August 12, 2023, at Baby Island Saratoga Club! Our BIHWA meeting will be held in conjunction with the Baby Island Beach Club meeting. The Beach Club meeting will begin at 9:00 am and the Water Association meeting will *immediately follow*.

Operations

During the past calendar year, we had two simultaneous causalities that resulted in our pumping almost 31% more water out of the ground over last year. While this is significantly more than we have drawn in the past five years on an annual basis, it is still less than 2002, when we extracted over 4 million gallons. Our reported metered consumption is still very close to last year's with less than a 1% increase reported. We need to ensure quick responses to any water leaks and ask all our members to monitor their locations. The Consumer Confidence Reports (previously mailed) show we have excellent water with no health issues. The system capacity is sufficient to cover our users, but we encourage conservation.

We have had repeated issues with King getting accurate water meter readings, so the board decided to take the meter reading function back in-house and has hired Chris Bryan to read the meters. That is going very well so far - thank you Chris!

King Water System has been purchased by a company from Oregon, Northwest Natural Water. We have made an initial contact with Northwest Natural so that we can get a better understanding of what to expect in the transition of Kings management. In our conversations with them it is their intention to bring better tools and management methods to improve King performance. King is still our satellite management agency. Just under new management.

We want to remind all members that it is important to conserve this resource, to shut off your water when you're out of town, and to report any leaks or issues quickly to King at 888-241-2503 or their emergency number 888-266-7048
